HB 51	Relative to Hemp-derived Cannabinoids and The Definition Of Cannabis In Therapeutic Cannabis. This bill would enable ATCs to expand their product offerings by utilizing non- intoxicating cannabinoids (e.g. CBD, CBG, and CBN) derived from hemp. HB 53	Permitting Qualifying Patients and Designated Caregivers to Cultivate Cannabis For Therapeutic Use. The House has now passed versions of this bill 12 times since 2009. HB 54	Allowing Alternative Treatment Centers to Operate For-profit. NH is the only state that still requires medical cannabis businesses to be non-profits. Since ATCs are not recognized as non-profits by the federal government, this policy has resulted in significantly increased costs for both businesses and patients.	Rep. Wendy Thomas; Rep. Heath Howard; Rep. Suzanne Vail Passed House HHSEA Committee 18-0. Retained by House Finance, Language added to House budget (HB 2).
HB 75	Legalizing Cannabis For Persons 21 Years Of Age or Older. This bill would legalize unlimited possession, production, and sale of cannabis for adults with no regulation of sales.	Rep. Kevin Verville House CJPS Committee voted 9-7 against. House rejected committee report 167-190 and passed bill in voice vote. Senate Judiciary Committee voted 3-1 against. Pending in full Senate.
HB 186	Relative to The Legalization and Regulation Of Cannabis and Making Appropriations	Rep. Jared Sullivan; Rep. Heath Howard

	Therefor. Similar to HB 639 from 2023, this bill would legalize cannabis for adults and set up an independent Cannabis Commission to regulate cannabis sales.	House Commerce Subcommittee voted 7-0 to retain. Retained for consideration later in 2025.
HB 196	Relative to Annulling Certain Cannabis Offenses. This bill would improve NH's process for annulling previous offenses for cannabis possession, including by waiving the fees.	Rep. HB 198	Relative to Legalizing Certain Quantities Of Cannabis and Establishing Penalties For The Smoking or Vaping Of Cannabis In Public. This bill would legalize limited possession of cannabis for adults with no retail sales.	Rep. Jared Sullivan; Rep. Heath Howard; Rep. Jonah Wheeler Passed House CJPS Committee 9-7. Passed House 208-125.
HB 190	Relative to Therapeutic Cannabis Possession Limits. <i>Purchasing and possession limits for</i> <i>registered patients would be increased from 2</i> <i>ounces to 4 ounces. This would allow patients</i> <i>who have difficulty traveling to make fewer trips</i> <i>to dispensaries.</i>	Rep. Heath Howard and six other representatives; Sen. Suzanne Prentiss <i>Passed House CJPS Committee</i> <i>14-0. Passed House in voice</i> <i>vote.</i>
HB 380	Relative to penalties for criminal violations of the therapeutic use of cannabis. This bill would eliminate the extra felony penalty for diverting therapeutic cannabis (selling cannabis is a felony in NH).	Rep. Suzanne Vail and five other representatives House CJPS Committee voted 9-6 against. House overturned this report and passed the bill.
HB 301	Relative to Cultivation Locations For Alternative Treatment Centers. This bill would allow ATCs to operate a greenhouse, subject to all the rules and regulations that apply to current ATC production facilities.	Rep. Suzanne Vail Passed House HHSEA Committee 18-0. Passed House in voice vote.
